From the Chair of the Parish Council

Hello.

A belated Happy New Year to you all. This year the Parish Council are looking forward to supporting the celebrations for the Coronation of our new King in May. Planning is already under way so please keep an eye out for further news as and when it becomes available. We are excited to be able to bring the village together again to celebrate this momentous occasion.

We are in the process of setting up a Good Neighbour Scheme in Gretton. The best help is often closest to home. Good Neighbour schemes are established and run by local people to provide day to day support to other residents who may need help on an occasional or regular basis. They



bridge that gap between formal and informal support at a local level and help to address the issue of social isolation that can affect so many residents, young and old. Each scheme is operated via a mobile phone which is held in turn by a core group of volunteers for an agreed period of time. Any resident in need of genuine help can ring the number and the co-ordinator will then identify an appropriate volunteer to provide the help requested and agree a time and date. Help is given free, although a reasonable charge is usually made for transport mileage.

The format of a Good Neighbour Scheme is determined by the people who use it. For example, you might want assistance in changing a light bulb, putting bins out, help with your smartphone or PC, help with light gardening, dog walking, fetching shopping or prescriptions, collecting or taking post to the Post Office, giving you a lift to vital appointments or the shops, or an occasional visit from a Good Neighbour (who might arrive with a little treat!) – or anything else that you feel would make your life a little bit easier or less stressful.

The success of such a scheme, of course, is dependent upon the volunteers who run it. We are looking for people from all age groups to get involved. This is a good opportunity for the younger members of our community to get involved. If you are participating in the Duke of Edinburgh awards (or something similar) or just want to learn about the rewards of volunteering, we will help you to do so under supervision and give you guidance and support. If you are an adult, then we will look to match your skills with the requests that come in. The benefits of volunteering offer the chance to get involved with your community and do as much or as little as you want. You may meet new people you might not otherwise have met and help reduce the feeling of social isolation. The rewards of being a volunteer are sometimes unexpected and it is often said that the volunteers get more out of such a programme than those using it.

Last, but not least, there are posters around the village showing the various "warm hubs" available to all. I am sure you will be greeted with a very warm welcome, so please do make use of them.

Coronation Celebrations in Gretton



In May we will be enjoying an additional Bank Holiday to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III. Plans for Gretton's Coronation Celebration got underway in January with a public meeting held in the Sports Pavilion to seek ideas and suggestions for how the village could celebrate.

The Coronation ceremony itself will occur on Saturday 6th May with national events of celebration taking place throughout the weekend. Our steering committee is proposing that Gretton joins with the Coronation Big Lunches that are occurring on Sunday 7th May. In a departure from our Jubilee celebrations however, we intend to relocate to the Recreation Ground. This will allow us to combine the Big Lunch with a wider Fun Day event on the field having had to cancel the 2022 event following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

colours – knitted or crocheted. Can you help us?





North Northants Community First Responders is a charity; we are a self-funded group of volunteers who offer their time to support the ambulance service. As CFRs we work alongside East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS). We are trained to respond to 999 and 111 calls within our local community.

If you would like to join us in any capacity, you would be more than welcome. We need responders, fundraisers, or any other support to keep our group financially viable and growing.

Gretton Village Hall Entertainments



Suitable for 14yrs + this show is sponsored by Northants Touring Arts and Arts Council England.


Later this year, on **Sunday Sept 30th**, we feature the welcome return of Canadian duo " **Over the Moon**", on their second UK tour. Hailing from

Gretton Local History Society

The society opened the new year of talks in January with a fascinating account of the history of the "Cullinan" diamond, now incorporated into the British Crown Jewels. Well known Gretton resident Bill Cullinan explained the history of the diamond (the largest ever found) and also his family connection with the owner of the mine where it was discovered. A very appreciative capacity audience was only disappointed by the lack of samples available to handle!

March 24th - "The Origins of the Medieval Village" by Andy Chapman. Gretton can lay claim to being a medieval village - it existed before the Norman Conquest and is listed in the Domesday Book.

May 26th - The "Northamptonshire Film Archive Trust" return by popular request with a programme including some early footage of Stewart & Lloyd's Corby steel works, as well as other mostly amateur Northamptonshire film.

July 28th - "Six Cheeses for Cromwell - the Story of Launde Abbey" by Ros Willatts. Launde Abbey, to the west of Oakham, is a much-modified Elizabethan manor house on the former site of an Augustinian Priory founded before 1125, but dissolved by Henry VIII.

Sept 22nd - "Warrior Women of the English Civil War" - by Stephen Barker. Though not often taking part in the conflict some women actively participated, and this talk looks at six women who fought, undertook spying missions and were involved in political negotiating. This meeting will be followed by the AGM.

Nov 24th - "Our County Record Office". Sarah Bridges will explain the work of the Archive Society and the types of record held, including examples from Gretton and our local area.

All meetings are held in the Village Hall commencing at 7.30pm. Society members (£10 per annum) have free entry to all talks but visitors are very welcome and pay £3 per talk.

We note that Corby Council has a group working on a Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan. We have expressed our opinion that safe routes from Gretton to Corby, and also to Priors Hall are essential.

Gretton Wombles

Why bother to pick up 'other people's litter'?

- For the sake of the oceans, wildlife and farm animals, and indeed human beings;
- The waste of resources which should be re-used, particularly aluminium cans;
- It looks awful!



Gretton Wombles was formed in February 2021, after various problems with litter around the village. We would like to see far more effective recycling, including a deposit and return scheme for drinks cans and plastic bottles.

In general people pick as individuals, and at their own risk, although for many years the village has organised two group litter picks per year, one in spring and one in autumn. Our next litter pick will be on a Saturday in late March or early April.

Safety Guidelines

Litter picking can be dangerous. We have issued the following safety guidelines for individuals -

- 1. Wear gloves when picking up litter.
- 2. Use a litter picker
- 3. Wear suitable shoes/boots
- 4. If you are by a road, Hi-Viz clothing is essential
- 5. Do not take risks near roads or water.
- 6. Don't pick up broken glass or needles these should be reported to the local council.

This activity is undertaken at your own risk. The group and admin accept no responsibility for accidents or injuries sustained during litter picking activities.

Contact the council

We are normally asked to leave collected litter near a council bin. If there is a small amount, I usually put it directly in the bin. If there is no bin near, you should contact the council to let them know.

Fly-tipping
