

Thank you Gretton for your support since I became your local CFR in January 2021. As CFRs we work alongside East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS). We are trained to respond to 999 and 111 calls. I work in Gretton and can buddy with another responder here or in Corby to extend my service.

We are looking for a Gretton buddy to volunteer with me to cover the village. If anyone is interested, I really need you, so please have a chat with me or contact <a href="mailto:admin@northnorthantscfr.nhs.uk">admin@northnorthantscfr.nhs.uk</a>.

As a completely self-funded voluntary group we need to raise all the funds we need to maintain the group. Currently we are raising funds to add bleed kits to our AED (defibrillators). Thank you to all those who have contributed to our collection boxes, collected drinks cans for the Leicester Royal Infirmary helipad, and sorted clothes handbags and shoes for our recycling bin.

We also have two defibrillators in the village, which I check monthly. To access these in an emergency, you need to ring 999 and if they assess that an AED is needed they will send you to the nearest accessible device.

Gretton Parish Council is seeking to recruit a Clerk who can assist and guide the Council. Applications are invited from suitably qualified and experienced persons, although training will be offered, and enthusiasm to learn and a "can do" attitude will be seen as an alternative to formal qualifications.

The Parish has a precept of £26,800 with an electorate of 1,185 people, and the Clerk will be the Proper Officer of the Council undertaking all the statutory duties entailed. The Clerk will also be the Responsible Financial Officer for maintaining all the financial records of the Council and ensuring the careful administration of its finances.

The position is part-time, approximately 11 hours per week and involves working from home and attending evening and daytime meetings when required. The number of hours required will be reviewed after six months. Salary is SPC 18-23, £13.21-14.67 per hour.

This position would suit a self-motivated, well organised person who can manage and prioritise their workload. Applicants should have good communication and computer skills, be able to take minutes and manage the council's administration and finances.

Duties include: working with councillors, setting agendas, minutes, and financial records, maintaining the council's website, ensuring compliance with all statutory requirements and regulations, advising the council on policies and activities and enacting the decisions of the council, liaison and instruction of contractors, and dealing with members of the public.



#### Recent activities:

Sara Earl worked with the school on climate change projects during Science Week in March, using WWF resources.

"I have a whole school assembly and worked with KS2 (higher junior classes) to understand their personal carbon footprint and how they put in actions to reduce it. Really good. They took loads on board and ran loads of climate based experiments and campaigns. "

We are also collecting empty blister packs for recycling.

From Sara Stewart "People can drop off blister packs to me at 57 High Street. I take them to Superdrug in Stamford."

Tesco, Co-op and Morrisons will take all soft plastics which cannot be re-cycled in council bins. This includes washed cat and dog food pouches, crisp packets and any other plastic, which when squeezed bounces back. So don't throw away, take back to the supermarkets.

Discussions are ongoing about an allotment.

We continue to support and publicise Rita the Refill Revolution van, which visits Gretton approximately once every two weeks. You can buy cleaning items, and various food items using your own containers - reducing the use of plastics.

We note that Corby Council has a group working on a Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan, and hope to give some input.



#### **GRETTON LITTER WOMBLES**

Why bother to pick up other people's litter? Personally I have three main reasons -

- for the sake of the oceans, wildlife and farm animals;
- because I hate the waste of resources which should be reused, particularly aluminium cans:
- because it looks awful.

The group was formed in February 2021, after various problems with litter around the village. There are a dozen people in the village who have equipment on loan. In general people pick as individuals, and at their own risk, although for many years the village has organised two group litter picks per year, one in spring and one in autumn.

We have issued the following safety guidelines for individuals -

- 1. Wear gloves when picking up litter.
- 2. Use a litter picker
- 3. Wear suitable shoes/boots
- 4. If you are by a road, Hi-Viz or bright clothing is essential
- 5. Do not take risks near roads or water.
- Don't pick up broken glass or needles these should be reported to the local council.

This activity is undertaken at your own risk. The group and admin can accept no responsibility for accidents or injuries sustained during litter picking activities.

In the early days, a lot of picking of roads around the village was done, as these can be much worse than in the village. But again, I emphasise that this can be dangerous and is entirely at your own risk.

No group litter picks were undertaken during lockdown, but on 2nd April 2022, a dozen or so volunteers and a few Parish Council members did a sterling job within the village, with the support of North Northants Council.

Aluminium drinks cans, either whole, or crushed top to bottom may be left at 18 Harringworth Road, or you can leave in the tall baskets at the Conservative Club in Corby. Go through the right hand gateway and the collection point is behind the building. These are collected for the Helipads for Hospitals Appeal.

We are normally asked to leave collected litter near a council bin - if there is a small amount, I usually put it directly in the bin. If there is no bin near, you should contact the council to let them know.

We also use Facebook groups to publicise information about litter, and to campaign for action such as a deposit return scheme on cans and plastic bottles, similar to schemes which exist in other countries.

#### **GRETTON LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY**

Former Gretton Manor Investigation;

In March we conducted geo-physical research in conjunction with Hallaton Archaeological and Field Research Group to try to discover the position and layout of this manor house which was demolished before Treswell's map of 1487. Analysis of the results is continuing, with a further session on the field being necessary due to excessive dryness limiting the the effectiveness of resistivity measurements. However, we can confirm the position of the modern drains!! The society thanks Ruth and Dan Doody for access to the field.

Our recent meeting " History of the Postcard " revealed many interesting facts about this ubiquitous communication, hugely popular, especially when there were two or three postal collections and deliveries each day.

The earliest cards had no pictures, and when illustrations and (later) photographs were added the message had to be written on the picture side. It was a very lucrative business, and one company ran a competition with a prize for the greatest number of their cards sent/ received by one person. Unfortunately the prize money was hardly enough to cover the card and postage cost, but it was very good for business!

Our village hall meetings continue:

July 22nd - " A History Mystery ". Sam Millard will present a series of historical events which are linked in some way - the audience will be challenged to suggest the connections.

Sept 25th - " The Northants Film Archive " will explain their foundation and development with some illustrative films.

Nov 25th - " An Almshouse Establishment" Nick Hill will talk about Browne's Hospital in Stamford. Founded in 1475 the history of the almshouse reveals a wide view of medieval life, and recent research has shown another purpose for the fine building.

All these meetings are held in the village hall, commencing at 7-30pm, and are open to all with visitors paying £3 per talk. Society members are admitted free (annual society membership currently £10 per year).

Darkie, the horse, had served in France during the 1914/18 war. He belonged to William Wootton, blacksmith
