

### From the Chair of the Parish Council

Hello and welcome to the summer 2023 edition of Gretton Life.

I was delighted to see that many of you had the opportunity to celebrate the King's Coronation and Big Lunch at the Recreation Ground in May. The Parish Council are proud to have facilitated the event with the help and support of the Friends of Gretton Recreation Ground and the Gretton Sports and Social Club, along with many other groups who were fundamental to its success. A big thank you to all those who helped out and especially to Cllr Fraser Wright for organising it. For those



who missed it, one of our residents, Frances Stubbs has uploaded a video on YouTube under "Gretton The Coronation Big Lunch". Do take a look.

We are very fortunate to have Darren Dovey, the ex-Chief Fire Officer for Northamptonshire, in the village. Darren has put together a Community Resilience Plan for the Parish Council. The aim of the community resilience plan is to increase short-term community resilience in response to an emergency occurring in the local area and to assist with the recovery from that emergency. We will be holding an open day at the Village Hall on the 1st July to promote it. This is an opportunity for you to come along and find out more. Please look out for advertising around the village and on Facebook for more details. The plan is currently available on the Parish Council website (Parish Documents/Other documents/Gretton Community Resilience) if you would like to read it.

I have been working with Sophie van den Bergh who is the project officer for the Building Links for Rockingham Forest group to investigate the feasibility of starting a Nature Recovery Plan for the parish. This is an exciting opportunity for the group to support and guide Gretton via a series of workshops; a user-friendly guide; and access to the expertise of the various partnerships they are working with, such as Natural England and the Wildlife Trust. The aim is to help the Parish Council secure and improve the environment and ecology within the parish boundary. We will be looking for volunteers from the community – from the youngest to the oldest – to help design the strategy for our local environment. If you have any interest in being involved, please do contact the Clerk to let us know. We will be reaching out in the coming months.

And finally, don't forget that the Gretton Good Neighbour Scheme is now up and running. Following on from the previous successful Skills Café, another event is in the planning. The telephone coordinator will be happy to arrange one of our registered volunteers to help you.

The telephone service is open between the hours of 9am and 7pm, 7 days a week. Please leave a message if we are unable to answer your call. We will always reply to your message within 24 hours.

#### What help is available?

**Transport** to appointments at the hospital, doctors, opticians, hairdressers, or dentists.

**Household tasks** such as changing light bulbs, replacing batteries, or moving small items of furniture. **Companionship** for people who would like a cup of tea and a chat or maybe a game of Scrabble or cards either for regular visits or one-off occasions.

**Support** while recuperating from illness, with things like gardening, caring for pets, collecting prescriptions, or helping with shopping.

**Help** with writing letters or filling in non-legal forms, reading to people with visual impairment or support using email and the Internet.


Who can use the scheme? Help is available to all residents in Gretton who need it.

Whilst having a stall at the Coronation Big Lunch/Fun Day, featuring the way Gretton celebrated previous Coronations, we were glad to meet several newcomers to the village and even signed up new society members.

We are now halfway through our 2023 programme of talks. The next is being given by Ros Willatts (formerly much involved in conservation planning for Harborough district) concerning the history of Launde Abbey. Situated to the west of Oakham, Launde is a much-altered Elizabethan manor house on the site of an Augustinian Priory founded before 1125 but dissolved by Henry VIII.



#### Schedule of talks:

July 28<sup>th</sup> "Six Cheeses for Cromwell" - the story of Launde Abbey by Ros Willatts.

Sept 22<sup>nd</sup> "Warrior Women of the English Civil War" by Stephen Barker. Stephen looks at six women who fought; undertook spying missions; or were involved in political negotiations. This meeting will be followed by our AGM.

Nov 24<sup>th</sup> "Our County Record Office"- Sarah Bridges will explain the scope of records held, including examples from Gretton.

All these talks are held in the Village Hall, commencing at 7.30pm. Society members (£10 per annum) have free entry, but non-members are very welcome and pay £3 per talk. 

#### **Gretton Paddock Park**

#### Koi Carp dumped in the pond!

Some weeks ago, we discovered that three Koi carp had been dumped in the pond. We have since seen several smaller fish which leads us to think that someone has irresponsibly emptied the contents of their pond with no regard for the wildlife.

The pond is not an ornamental one, but one to encourage wildlife. The impact of Koi carp is devastating: newts will avoid such ponds; the carp root around digging up the vegetation and eat the plants; they eat aquatic insects, insect larvae, snails and tadpoles and disturb the bottom sediments creating poor conditions for the wildlife.



It is very easy to put the fish in but weeks later we still have them, even with the efforts that have been made to remove them.

On a lighter note, in late summer we will be carry out our annual hay cut of the wildflower meadow areas and inspect and clean the bird boxes.

If you would like to help, please come along, you do not need to make a regular commitment. It is also a very nice way to meet new friends.

#### Monitoring our plants and wildlife

We need to know what we are doing right and what we might be doing wrong in order to improve the biodiversity of the pocket park. This requires us to record our plants and wildlife. Would you like to help with this aspect?

#### Safety Guidelines

Litter picking can be dangerous. We have issued the following safety guidelines for individuals -

- 1. Wear gloves when picking up litter.
- 2. Use a litter picker
- 3. Wear suitable shoes/boots
- 4. If you are by a road, Hi-Viz clothing is essential
- 5. Do not take risks near roads or water.
- 6. Don't pick up broken glass or needles these should be reported to the local council.

This activity is undertaken at your own risk. The group and admin accept no responsibility for accidents or injuries sustained during litter picking activities.

#### Contact the Council

We are normally asked to leave collected litter near a council bin. If there is a small amount, I usually put it directly in the bin. If there is no bin near, you should contact the council to let them know.



#### SKATE PARK AND OUTDOOR GYM UPDATE

Funding has been approved for new skatepark and outdoor gym in Gretton. Skateboarders, shredders and BMX riders in Gretton are set to get a new skatepark and outdoor gym thanks to a £100,000 grant from FCC Communities Foundation. The money will be used to install a brand new skatepark and outdoor gym equipment at the Gretton Recreation Ground. The Friends of Gretton Recreation Ground are leading the project.



This project will provide a real social and health boost to the people of Gretton and it is fantastic that FCC

Communities Foundation has awarded the village the funds and we're really looking forward to our park additions taking shape over 2023.

The Friends of Gretton Recreation Group are leading on the installation which will be located on Kirby Road Recreation Ground, adjacent to the MUGA (multi-use games area). The accountable body, Gretton Parish Council, will appoint a partner to work with the Friends Group in the designing, consultation and building of the new flow with a street style plaza and a selection of outdoor gym equipment. A large amount of the funding has been awarded by FCC Community Fund and an additional amount from the North Northants Council community grant. In addition to this young people of the village have been fundraising to 'add to the pot', with a sponsored bike ride and Slushie Tuck Shop. More fundraising events will take place this summer.

A key element of the project will be to consult on the design with the users of the park and young people. If you would like to be part of this process please do engage with the Friends of Group. We meet on a regular basis at the Sports Pavilion. We have already had feedback that users would like to see the park have more accessibility and activities for girls, so we are eager to know your ideas and thoughts on improvements.
